The [48th FEBS Congress 'Mining biochemistry for human health and well-being'](#) will be held in Milano from June 29th to July 3rd, 2024.

The congress will celebrate the 60th anniversary of FEBS and will present a broad-spectrum and ground-breaking scientific program, completed in a fruitful collaboration with the journals of FEBS and representatives from FEBS Constituent Societies. The focus on human health and well-being, through molecular and cellular science approaches, reflects a key social issue and a specific commitment of SIB and the whole biochemical community in a time of ongoing global transitions. Besides important research topics following the latest and emerging developments in the biochemical sciences, the Congress activities include dedicated education-oriented sessions, symposia organized by young biochemists, and biochemistry-related economic discussions.

The list of plenary speakers includes 4 Nobel Prize winners (Bruce Butler, Robert Huber, Venki Ramakrishnan, and John Walker) and several distinguished scientists active in all the fields of the biochemical research.

Experienced mentors and trainee moderators will facilitate active participation in scientific discussion to allow all attendees to be engaged as participants rather than spectators. As alluded to by the slogan of the YSF logo, the interdisciplinary nature of biochemistry will bridge the gap between different disciplines supporting progress of humanity in areas such as health, agriculture and the environment.

FEBS short-term Fellowships

FEBS Short-Term Fellowships are awarded throughout the year for the purpose of scientific collaboration, advanced training or employing techniques not available at the candidate's usual place of work. Fellowships are granted for periods of no longer than two or, in exceptional cases, three months. Applicants must have a PhD or at least one published paper as a main author in an international scientific journal and should normally be scientists who have obtained their PhD degree within the past six years.
